



Preserving The Frazer Center Forest for our Community

It has been just over one year since the Lake Claire Neighborhood Association and Friends of the Frazer Center Forest started actively helping to preserve the virgin forest that the Frazer Center inhabits. Volunteer efforts have included mulching paths, creating seating areas, pulling evasive plant material and preserving native plants. We would like to thank each of you for your efforts to ensure the long life of The Frazer Center Forest.

In preserving the life of the forest for the community, there are just a few things that we ask of our neighboring friends. The Frazer Center exists to provide a safe, quality, learning environment for children and adults with disabilities. You'll notice when strolling through our property our many children and adults are also out enjoying the estate. For this reason, we have to stay in line with the DeKalb County leash law and ensure that ALL dogs remain on leashes at ALL times for the protection of all those that the Center serves. Also owners must remove all pet waste, as is required by DeKalb County law.

Although the Center may be closed on the weekends to

students, our work is never done. The Cator Woolford Gardens, which benefits The Frazer Center greatly, is open on the weekends. Therefore, we ask that our neighbors not visit the Gardens during events; the Gardens, parking lots and driveways are closed during these times. We have signs posted when an event is in progress at both our gates and new signage to be placed at trail openings. Lastly, because the Cator Woolford Gardens are used for events, we do not allow dogs in the Garden area at anytime.



For alternative off-leash locations, consider the Piedmont Park Off-Leash Dog Park on Park Drive; Mason Mill Park off Clairmont Road in north DeKalb; and the new leash-free areas of parks in Decatur including Adair and Glenlake and the greenspace adjacent to Oakhurst Park.

Please remind your neighbors and help us all keep this amazing oasis beautiful and safe for our community.

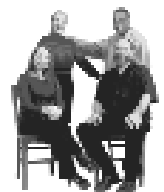

LITTLE 5 POINTS LAUNCHES THE FINDLEY FAIR

The Little 5 Points Business Association is proud to announce the launch of an ongoing monthly event, The Findley Fair. maintenance. The dedication ceremony will be accompanied by Avolonte Winds, a woodwind quintet, A Kick in the Brass band and unveiling of new Findley Plaza signage.
