## A Message from District 5 Councilwoman Natalyn Mosby Archibong

On November 7, 2005 I was one of three council members who voted against the creation of the Beltline Tax Allocation District (TAD). Itemized below is a summary of the major reasons that I did not support the creation of the Beltline TAD in 2005. This vote reflects concerns and reservations about the TAD and NOT opposition to Atlanta's Beltline.

The City of Atlanta does not have a comprehensive traffic or transit plan. How do we know that this particular plan is the best way to capture our need to establish transportation-oriented development?

MARTA will not reach a decision regarding its Inner Core Transit Feasibility Study until June 2006. If MARTA does not select the Beltline Concept from several options as its locally preferred alternative, federal funds will be unlikely for the Beltline. Federal funding for this project, if granted, will require a 50% local match estimated to be \$500 million to \$605 million. Will the TAD generate sufficient funds to meet Atlanta's local match requirement AND fund land acquisition AND pay for Beltline construction? Funding for maintenance and operating costs have not been quantified nor have funding sources been identified. The proposed transit component, excluding bike trails and walking paths, is not scheduled to occur for ten or more years. Why the rush to approve the TAD now?

State law authorizes the creation of a TAD to redevelop areas that "have not been subject to growth and development through private enterprise and would not reasonably be anticipated to be developed without the approval of the redevelopment plan." Large segments of the proposed Beltline TAD do not fit this description. Many projects along the Beltline are already under development, have obtained preliminary sewer capacity reviews (a major step in the development process), or are already in the construction phase....without TAD financing.

The City of Atlanta will be required to provide full city services to residents of the Beltline TAD, but none of the taxes paid by a resident in the TAD will go into the City's general fund. By contrast the Atlanta Board of Education grants their support for TADs only after it is assured a share of the TAD proceeds to offset the expenses of delivery of school services within the TAD. Why doesn't the City of Atlanta reserve a percentage of TAD proceeds for this same purpose? Research conducted by Georgia State University projected that there will be a tax shortfall of \$267 million dollars as the result of the Beltline TAD. If this prediction is correct, taxpayers living outside of the TAD, including District 5 and Kirkwood, will face certain tax increases.

I have spent many hours conducting research regarding the myriad issues related to the creation of this TAD. I support efforts that encourage smart growth and the utilization of public transportation and I support the creation of an "emerald necklace" surrounding the inner core of the City of Atlanta. However, in light of the concerns articulated above, I could not support the re-direction of approximately \$547 million dollars in City taxes based largely upon the unsubstantiated fear that if we don't do it now, we never will. If this vision is worth supporting, it should be worth supporting in 2006 after thorough deliberation. In 2006, we would have the benefit of knowing which option Marta selected for its locally preferred alternative, we would have a better understanding of the ramifications of the widespread assessment errors discovered during a recent audit of the Fulton County Tax Assessor's Office, and we could complete a comprehensive transportation plan for the City.

Now that the Beltline TAD has been approved I will do everything within my power to make this TAD and especially the Beltline a success.

# Responsible Pet Ownership = Pet Identification

Stanley is a beautiful ten-month-old schnauzer mix, grey with a white chest and recently groomed. Every time I pass by Stanley's cage at the Southern Hope Humane Society's Fulton Animal Services shelter, he looks at me with eyes that seem to say "Why am I here and where is my mom?" He is sharing his kennel with Max, a small six year old yellow lab mix and Freddie, a one year old purebred cocker spaniel. All three dogs look well cared for and all probably have wonderful owners somewhere who are worried about them. The problem is that these owners didn't realize that one of the most important things a responsible pet owner MUST do is to keep identification on their pets at all times so they can be reunited if the pet gets lost.

Here at Southern Hope's Fulton Animal Services shelter, we impound about 40 lost Fulton County animals every day. We also receive frantic calls from people who have lost their pets and who are desperately trying to find them. When asked if their pet had any identification, at least 90% of the time the answer that is given is "no." The reasons vary, but people often say that they had just taken their pet's collar off to give them a bath, that they keep a collar on but no ID tags, that the tags fell off and they never replaced them or that the sound of jingling tags keeps them up at night so they removed the collar. Amazingly, they even tell us that they only put on a collar and tags when they take them out for a walk. However, if you ask anyone that works at an animal shelter if their pet has ID, you will find that they're obsessive about keeping ID tags on their pets 24/7 and that all of their pets are also microchipped. That's because shelter workers know that without pet identification, the chances of ever finding a lost pet is less than 10% for a dog and less than 2% for a cat. With identification, 90% of dogs and cats are reunited with their owners.

Unfortunately, I witness many disturbing things at the animal shelter because there are so many irresponsible pet owners. But one of the most upsetting things that I have to deal with is the fact that we impound loving pet owners' pets and those pets risk euthanasia simply because we have no way of finding their owners. Please make sure your pet has an ID tag on at all times and microchip your pet as a backup. Your pet's life, and your peace of mind, may one day depend on it.

#### **School News**

Mary Lin Elementary School has been actively involved in providing support for evacuees from the Gulf Coast region following Hurricane Katerina. Even before the adults decided on a response, the student council sold pickles to raise over \$700 for the people displaced by the hurricane. A PTA-sponsored, long-term "sister school" project is being developed to help a Gulf community school, already in need, to rebound. Through the national PTA's database, "school adoptions" are being arranged through the state departments of education.

Grady High School captured two National Scholastic Press Association Pacemaker Awards at the fall national high school journalism convention in Chicago on November 12. Grady News Network won the school's first Broadcast Pacemaker Award while The Southerner won its third straight Newspaper Pacemaker Award. Grady was the only school in the nation to earn Pacemaker Awards in both the broadcast and newspaper categories. The school has won the newspaper award five times in the past nine years. The Pacemaker Award is considered the Pulitzer Prize of scholastic journalism.





## MEET YOUR NEIGHBOR: PHIL COLSON, WOODTURNER

Lake Claire resident Phil Colson isn't afraid to admit

he's in touch with his feminine side. Considering the kind of work of he does – a wood turner who creates "wooden jewels" such as bowls, spurtles (a Scottish stirring stick) to gems like a kitchen sink and delicate vessels — Colson needs to be. As a woodturner, the majority of people who buy and are interested in his work are women. "Women have a better sense of proportion than men." Colson said. To the feminine eye and mind, an art object's form, flow, shape and curve matter. Even how the object feels held in one's hand could determine whether it suits the feminine sense. For such reasons, and because he himself appreciates the

feminine taste in the art and craft he creates, Colson said his work is now evolving more to the feminine side.

Not surprisingly, it was also a feminine figure in his life who introduced him to the tool that started him on the path of woodturning. Colson began turning nearly five years ago when his wife, Nella Rigell, surprised him with a mini lathe, a machine that turns a piece of wood in a circular motion so a turner can use his tools to carve the wood into

desired shapes. Since then, he said woodturning has become such a passion of his that he calls it "a disease" and "an addiction." He turns whenever he has the chance, usually about 15 to 20 hours a week, and often more during the warmer months when he can be inside his turning shop at his home on Palifox without the colder temperatures being a hindrance. "If you start turning wood and it grabs you - you have to turn," Colson said. "I love to solve problems and every piece of wood is unique and every piece of wood (for turning) is a problem that needs to be solved." For him, the lathe is like the potter's wheel and the wood is like a piece of clay. It's during the turning process that he finds what shape is inside the wood. Woodturning has become so much a part of

his being that he said it's even changed the way he sees his world. "If you're driving down the street and there's a pretty girl walking and beech tree, I'll be looking at the beech tree," Colson jokes. The love for his "habit" today turns out wood pieces that sell for no less than \$100. He also teaches woodturning, holds seminars and enjoys sharing his art and craft with others.
