This month's tips: If you are traveling and you have a garden that will need attention, make sure you have a reliable "garden sitter" to water well at least once if you are gone a week or so. You may even check with our neighborhood landscapers to see if they may perform this service for a fee. Potted plants will need more frequent watering in the absence of rainfall or exposure to the rain. Who wants to come home to dead plants? If you have a vegetable garden, invite a neighbor to harvest while you are away. It will help encourage continued production and it will be a great incentive for them to water for you while you are away. If you have removed spent veggie plants such as broccoli or collards, replace them with a new planting of most any variety of beans. They will germinate just fine in the hot weather.

down and teaches you to use long, deep breaths. Sitali Breath stimulates the flow of apana, the eliminative force in the body. It aids digestion, urination, impotency,

menstruation and exhalation. It is an excellent breath to practice for anxiety, frustration or anger, when our energy is too "hot."

Technique: Sit comfortably on a cushion or a chair with the spine long and open, keeping the chest lifted and the head level. Curl the tongue like a straw and stick your tongue a little way out of the mouth. Inhale deeply through the curled tongue. Retract the tongue into the mouth, and exhale through the nose. Do this with very long deep breaths. If you are unable to curl the tongue, simply inhale across the surface of the tongue. Continue for 3 to 11 minutes.

Don't Go Near the Water

In late May, students in a Field Ecology class at the Paideia School discovered coliform bacteria in the water that flows through the Candler Park neighborhood. The high school students were learning the standard tests for determining water quality, including detection of the presence of any bacteria that comes from animal waste (including humans). They were surprised when they found the fecal coliform bacteria in high levels in the Lullwater Fork of Peavine Creek (sometimes called Candler Park Brook) between the bike path bridge and the Ponce de Leon bridge. Like modern medical detectives, they tested further and further upstream in an attempt to locate the source of the bacteria. While there were some bacteria present in the channel that drains Candler Park, the concentration was much higher in the channel that runs west-to-east behind Fairview Road and along the bike path. They were able to trace constant high concentrations all the way up to the edge of Freedom Park at the intersection of Euclid Avenue and North Avenue. This means that the source of the bacteria is somewhere between that location and Little Five Points, the high point of the area.

The students compiled a report and sent it to the City of Atlanta. The City sent people from the Wastewater Department at least three times to locate the source of the bacteria. So far, they report they cannot detect any place where the sewer lines are leaking into the creek. However, they have not been able to identify an alternative source of the pollution. Until the source is located and cleaned up, they recommend keeping children and pets out of the creek.

This distressing news comes at a time when the neighborhood is involved in a major effort to improve the water quality of Candler Park Brook. The current construction in Candler Park is part of a joint Atlanta/EPA grant effort sponsored by CPNO and others to improve storm water detention and water flow by naturalizing the path of the creek through Candler Park along the golf course. When this project is completed in the fall, water should move more slowly and attractively through the Park, allowing natural processes to improve the quality of the water. Sources of coliform bacteria must be found and eliminated to aid in that effort. We must also be alert for any illegal dumping. In mid-May someone dumped a white, milky substance into the Creek that killed fish and other aquatic life in the pond just downstream from the bike path bridge.





Killin' Kudzu Ain't Easy by Kathy Evans

Kids used to tell horror stories about what you could find in the kudzu along Georgia roadsides when I was growing up. Certain roadscapes still remind me, "You don't ever want to run off the road around here, because if you did and got knocked out, the kudzu could grow up over your whole car in just one night and they'd never find you..." Unfortunately both sides of McLendon Avenue near Lake Claire Park are becoming a bit like those roadsides.

The real problem with kudzu is that it kills or degrades other more desirable and native plants by shading or smothering them under a blanket of leaves, girdling stems and tree trunks, and even by breaking branches and uprooting massive trees with its weight. And kudzu is incredibly tenacious and difficult to get rid of; the longer you ignore it, the worse the problem becomes. While digging up the tap roots is effective, roots can weigh literally hundreds of pounds and grow to a depth of nine feet, making this method very difficult in all but very small areas. The most effective method of management requires a combination of carefully timed and repeated cutting along with herbicidal treatment at the correct intervals. If you have kudzu in your yard, it is best to keep mowing it and cutting it back before it has the chance to become a greater nuisance. We have initiated this type of management for the kudzu near the north side of McLendon in Lake Claire Park, near homes on McLendon and Lake Shore Drive. The work has been made possible by LCN and the Lake Claire Garden Club

with a micro-grant through Park Pride Atlanta. Work has included cutting back privet and other large invasive plants, cutting kudzu, and carefully-timed herbicidal spraying. We now need to raise approximately \$300 to complete the process of cutting and spraying again.
