Kirkwood and NPU-O Need our Help!

To Our Neighbors In Lake Claire - As some of you may know, the historic Pratt Pullman Rail Yard in Kirkwood (your neighbors due south across the rail lines) is threatened by proposed installation of a Georgia Power substation. These unique, historically and architecturally significant, and amazingly intact 103 year old structures represent a great deal of the industrial and economic history of this area from 1904 on and are owned by the State of Georgia. They are the group of very large brick industrial rail buildings readily visible from Lake Claire's Dekalb Avenue that I hope some of you were able to tour during our spring festival. The proposed substation will be at least 1.5 acres in size and directly impact these historical structures. It is dependent on a transfer of land from the State of Georgia to Georgia Power.



AARF Be ready to take action to help save strays

If you know in your heart that you're a rescuer, why not equip yourself to do the best possible job?



If you see a stray that you cannot safely restrain, call the local animal care and control agency (in rural areas, call the police or sheriff) and report the situation.

If you are able to transport the animal, go to www. spotsociety.org for a complete list of rescue groups and shelters you can call for help finding a home. (Just remember to be patient with rescue groups, since most are run by volunteers and are almost always at capacity.)

The Humane Society offers more helpful step-bystep information on how to help a homeless animal at www.hsus.org/pets/pet_care. You can also get great guidance at the click of a mouse by visiting www.aarfatlanta.org and clicking the "Resources for You" link at the bottom of the page.

Here are some things to have in your car at all times: Phone, Phone numbers of local animal control, shelters (see website) and a 24-hour emergency vet clinic, cat carrier or cardboard box, collars and strong leashes for dogs, a heavy blanket, bowls and water, treats and strong-smelling foods like canned tuna or dried liver, and an animal first-aid kit.





City's Automated Meter Reading Project to Enhance Billing and Customer Service

The City of Atlanta recently launched its ATL READ Automated Meter Reading (AMR) project to

Over the next three years, the Department of Watershed Management will install the AMR device on each water meter in Atlanta's distribution system. Aged, non-functioning meters will be replaced with new meters already fitted with the AMR device, while the AMR device will be installed on existing meters that are still functioning properly and are compatible with the new device. The \$35 million project is part of the City's \$3.9 billion Clean Water Atlanta infrastructure improvement program to rehabilitate Atlanta's wastewater and drinking water systems.

After the device is installed, a meter reader in a vehicle fitted with a mobile data collector then needs only to drive by customer locations each month to capture meter readings

The Automated Meter Reading project is another in a long line of initiatives the Department is undertaking to ensure that our bills are accurate and reflect exact customer usage," Commissioner Robert Hunter said. "It will help us reduce our operating expenses and identify potential leaks and other distribution system problems, as well as meter malfunctions, vandalism and tampering.

upgrade Atlanta's water meters and allow them to be read electronically. The new capability will simplify the meter reading process, ensure the accuracy of the billing system and improve customer service.

AMR system technology, which is being used successfully by numerous local and national utilities, permits the electronic collection and trans-





The AMR pilot project started in northwest and west Atlanta neighborhoods in December. AMR installation will now continue in those areas and begin in North Fulton and Sandy Springs. Residential customers will receive a postcard notice in the mail two weeks prior to the start of installation on their street. Commercial customers will receive a letter and will be contacted by K&V Automation, the City's contractor on the project, to arrange an appointment for installation.

There is no cost to customers for installing the new meter reading device and new water meter, and the project's impact will be minimal. An installer will work at each meter box for about an hour. Some customers may experience a brief interruption of water service if their meter must be replaced. The meter's appearance will not change; however, meters will now be covered with a locked lid to protect the AMR device and reduce meter damage and tampering.


ROBBERY – PEDESTRIAN



The Conscientious Gardener

"Decomposing Composting" Part I of II

Composting is an easy, cheap, and environmentally friendly way to reduce landfill waste and boost plant performance. There are many different composting methods detailed in books and Web sites. The methods range from "throw a bunch of stuff in a pile" to "precisely measure and monitor daily". This article presents two easy methods that work for me: 1) open pile for yard material and 2) compost tumbler for kitchen scraps. This month we'll cover the open pile method.

Composting Basics

Gardening books and Web sites explain composting's biological process in varying detail. Basically, any material that came from the earth can decompose and go back into the earth. Microorganisms do the work by breaking down the material into humus (hyoo-muhs). Humus is dark organic material essential to soil fertility.

The methods explained in this article use four ingredients: heat, oxygen, green material, and brown material. Heat is from the sun. Oxygen is from mixing / turning the material. Green materials can

be from the kitchen (e.g. fruits, vegetables, coffee grounds, and tea bags) or the yard (e.g. flowers and grass clippings). Brown material is primarily from the yard, such as twigs, straw, and leaves. Don't worry—exact classification of green or brown material isn't required!

Method 1: Open Pile Yard Material

Step 1: Collect curbside yard waste bags that contain grass, leaves, small twigs, trimmings, etc. The bags don't really contain waste. Instead, they contain a compost pile's key ingredients. The bags are so valuable that I now call them "Bags of Gold." Store the bags out of the rain to prevent sogginess.

Step 2: Find a spot of yard soil that gets full sun. If you plan to make a big pile, find a big spot. Some people construct a three-sided bin to contain the pile. You can make your own (plans can be found on the Web) or you can use discarded pallets. See Figure 1 for my jury-rigged setup. It's ugly...but functional and free!

Step 3: In the chosen spot, dig a shallow crater and loosen the exposed soil. This is the "compost catalvst".

Step 4: Make a mound of yard material. I don't worry about the exact ratio of green and brown material since the bags produce some kind of mixture of





materials. Avoid using an over-abundance of weeds in the pile. Shred the bag and put in the pile—it decomposes too!

Step 5: Some people turn the pile, others don't. Once a while, I use a pitchfork to turn the pile and bring some air into the mix. If there's been a lot of rain. I'll mix in dry leaves.

Step 6: There's no exact time when you get humus at the bottom of the pile. Lift a pitchfork-full of material near the edge. If you see dark brown flaky soil stuff, then you've got humus!

Step 7: Before using humus, consult a gardening book as some plants, such as purple coneflower, don't thrive in fertile-rich soil. When you do use, it spread it around plants and trees, mix it into the soil in the spring, and use it like mulch on bare soil.
